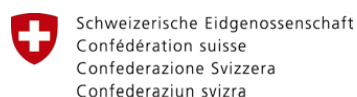

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Sustainable development requires risk-informed leadership at governmental level to avoid the creation of new risks and reducing existing ones. Most Latin American countries adopted such a leadership system aligned with the Hyogo Framework for Action (2005-2015). Thus, in Peru, in 2011, the National Disaster Risk Management System (SINAGERD) was established.

This projects aims to strengthen this risk governance structure in collaboration with all involved institutions, thereby contributing to one of the four priorities of the Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) adopted in 2015.

Context

The framework of SINAGERD has overcome great legal, structural and instrumentation challenges. However, after eight years in operation it is important and necessary to update the vision of the functioning of the SINAGERD, from the national and regional/local levels, from the sectors and territories, and from the multiplicity of the public and private entities that conform it and the different roles and functions that these have in the SINAGERD.

Understanding the importance of disaster risk reduction for the fulfillment of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), SDC and the United Nations Development Program (UNDP) support the strengthening of SINAGERD with a commitment to accompany the efforts that the Presidency of the Council of Ministers has been promoting to consolidate the incorporation of disaster risk management in the country.

Objectives and lines of intervention

To lay the groundwork for a new project to strengthen the SINAGERD within the framework of national priorities and the fulfillment of the Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction (SFRDRR), the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) of the Agenda 2030 through subsequent consulting activities:

- Update of the National Disaster Risk Management Policy (funded by UNDP).
- Analysis of the organization, operability, functionality of the technical entities and composition of the National System of Disaster Risk Management - SINAGERD, which will serve, among other aspects, to guide cross-cutting and intergovernmental strategies to enhance the effectiveness of SINAGERD and strengthen capacities at the three levels of government (funded by SDC).
- Technical assistance in Disaster Risk Management for the identification of proposals and recommendations based on international and national experience, to contribute to the process of analysis of the functioning and operation of the National System for Disaster Risk Management - SINAGERD in Peru (financed by SDC).
